
#### **India-U.S. Bilateral Relationship**

- Areas of Cooperation: Trade and economic, defense and security, education, science and technology, high-technology, civil nuclear energy, space technology and applications, clean energy, environment and health
- Agreement on Framework for Cooperation on Trade and Investement(2010)
- Bilateral trade is expected to cross US\$100 billion this year
- Although there has been increased cooperation between the two countries- potential areas need to be tapped and developed

Bilateral trade between India and the US recorded a growth of 932.14% in a span of 21 years




## India's trade with the US has declined as a Proportion of India's Global <u>Trade</u>

### **BIT Agreement**

- Both countries express interest but doubts remain on both sides
- For US, India holds great potential
  - Recent Indian Agreements: India-Japan CEPA, India-Korea CEPA, India-Malaysia CECA, India-Singapore CECA
  - India-EU Bilateral Trade Investment Agreement (BTIA) also to be finalized soon
- For India, US association is important for its development
  - US would facilitate additional investment inflows in infrastructure and other priority areas

- Investor Arbitration Clause: Implications for sovereign regulatory action and decisions by all state organs.
   Desirability of balancing protection with regulatory function within context of developing economy
  - Challenging Tax Laws
  - Coal Price Legislation
  - Court Decision
