Professor Amit Shovon Ray is Professor of Economics at the Centre for International Trade and Development, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. He was educated at Presidency College, Calcutta and at the University of Oxford. Presently, he is on leave from JNU on an invitation to hold a Chair (Chair Professor of Trade, Technology and Competitiveness) at ICRIER.

Professor Ray has held research and teaching positions at premier Universities and Institutions in India and abroad, including Oxford University Institute of Economics and Statistics, International Food Policy Research Institute (Washington DC), Jawaharlal Nehru University (New Delhi), University of Calcutta (Kolkata) and Indian Institute of Technology (Delhi).
