Overview

* Taiwan:

- GDP, 2009- US\$ 734.3 billion, Global ranking-25
- Major trading partners: China, Japan, Hong Kong and US
- Major items of trade: electronics, machinery, optical instruments and mineral fuels

India:

- GDP, 2009-\$874.94 billion, Global ranking-11
- Major trading partners: US, UAE, China and UK
- Major items of trade: petroleum products, precious stones, machinery, iron and steel, chemicals, vehicles, apparel

Overview contd...

- ❖ Bilateral trade, 2010: \$4,490 million; low
- * Taiwan not among top 10 trading partners of India.
- ❖ India has a negative trade balance with Taiwan.
- * Bilateral trade is growing.
- India's major export items to Taiwan: mineral products, base metals and related articles and chemical products
- * Taiwan's major export items to India: machinery and mechanical appliances, chemical products and wood
